## Five things to keep in mind when disposing of household garbage

How to Dispose of Household Garbage



### How to dispose of masks and tissues used by people who have or may have COVID-19

(1) Put a garbage bag in your garbage can, and try not to fill it up too much!



(2) Remove the air from the garbage bag and tie it tightly!



(3) Wash your hands with soap after you put the garbage out!



Please follow these rules to protect your family and those who handle the garbage.

# Rules for Disposing of Recyclables and Garbage

## 01

Please dispose of your recyclables and garbage by 8:30 a.m. on the designated day at the designated collection area.

**Don't do it the night before!**



## 02

Please sort your garbage properly into the bags designated for recyclables, burnable garbage, and non-burnable garbage. Tie them up tightly before disposing of them.

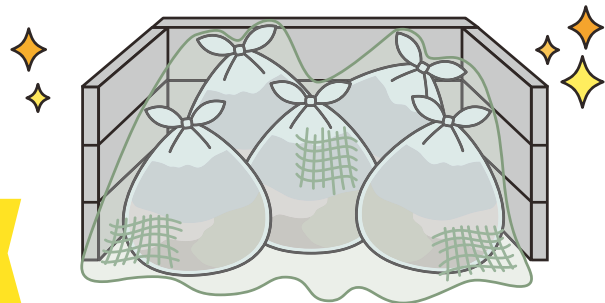
**Each household can dispose of up to three bags.**



## 03

If there is a net, please put it over your garbage properly.

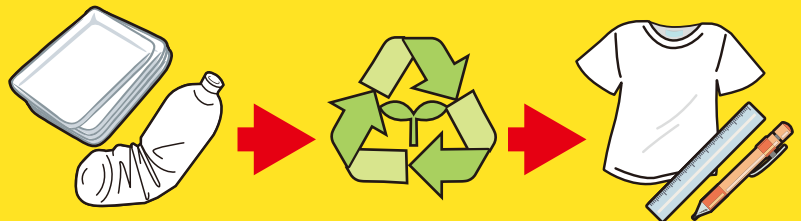
**Garbage generated by businesses and stores cannot be disposed of in the collection areas.**



## Requests from Bin-chan & Kan-chan



Plastic containers, packaging, and PET bottles are recyclables too. They can be recycled into new clothes and stationery.



Paper that's larger than the size of a business card is recyclable. Put it in a paper bag or wrap it in a large sheet of paper and dispose of it as a recyclable item.



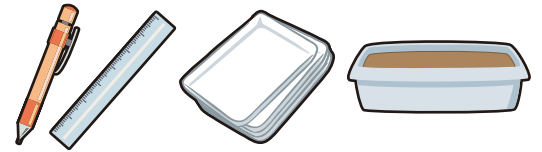
# Plastic Containers and Packaging

Put them in the **burnable garbage** collection area by 8:30 a.m. on the collection day.



Plastic containers and packaging are plastic items that contained products (containers) or were used to wrap them (packaging) that are no longer needed once the items are used.

When we recycle the things we collect,



**Pens and rulers**   **Trays**   **Planters**  
they're reborn as new plastic products!

## Key points for disposal!



Look for this mark!  
\*Not all items are marked.



Rinse them lightly to remove dirt.



Put them in a bag and dispose of them.

**Everyone should rinse and recycle!**

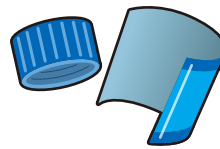

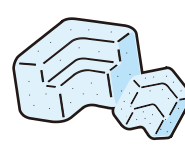

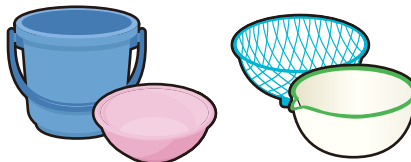

### Disposal method and cautions

- Please put the items into a bag designated for recyclables, tie it up, and dispose of it.
- Rinse the items lightly. If the dirt won't come off, dispose of them as burnable garbage.
- Lighters and blades are non-burnable garbage. Never put them in with recyclables.

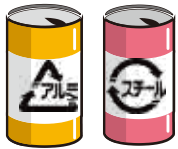
# Empty Cans and Metals

Recyclables

Put them in the **non-burnable** garbage collection area by 8:30 a.m. on the collection day.



## Covered items (Main categories)



Aluminum and steel cans



Pots, kettles, and frying pans

You can dispose of these without removing the handles and knobs.



Spray cans

You don't have to put holes in these.

**Please use up all the contents of spray cans!**

\*When using it up, do so in a well-ventilated outdoor area away from fire.

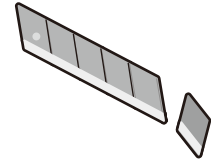
## Items that cannot be disposed of as empty cans or metals (Examples)



Kitchen knives



Razors



Box cutter blades

Items such as kitchen knives and razors are dangerous, so please wrap them in sturdy paper, write what's inside on the paper, and dispose of them as non-burnable garbage.



## Disposal method and cautions

- Please put the items into a bag designated for recyclables, tie it up, and dispose of it.
- Lightly rinse cans that contained drinks or food.
- Please use up all the product in cassette gas cylinders and spray cans.
- Items longer than 60 cm that do not fit in the designated garbage bags, or those weighing more than 6 kg, are considered large garbage items.

# PET Bottles

Put them in the **non-burnable** garbage collection area by 8:30 a.m. on the collection day.



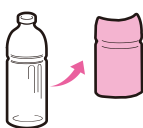
## Covered items (Main categories)



PET bottles containing drinks, soy sauce, alcohol, etc.



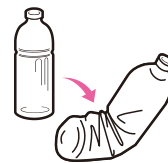
PET bottles have this mark on their label or on the bottom of the bottle.



Remove the cap and easy-to-remove label



Rinse lightly



Crush as much as possible



## Disposal method and cautions

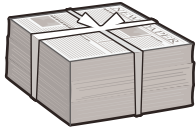
- Please put the items into a bag designated for recyclables, tie it up, and dispose of it.
- Empty the contents before disposing of them.
- Remove the caps and labels and dispose of them as plastic containers and packaging. If you can't remove them, you can dispose of them as is.

# Recyclables Collected in the Community

Put them in the collection area set up by the neighborhood association or other entity between 7:30 a.m. and 9:00 a.m. on the collection day.

Please separate the papers by type and tie them up firmly with string in a cross-shape knot before disposing of them.



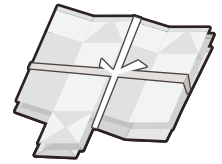

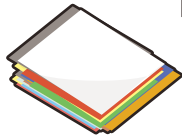

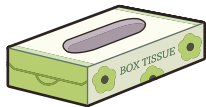
Paper waste

Paper that's larger than the size of a business card can be disposed of as a recyclable item.



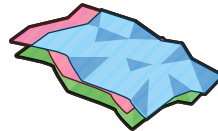

### Disposal method and cautions

- Cloth that is dirty, damaged, or wet cannot be recycled and should be disposed of as burnable garbage.
- Futons, floor cushions, stuffed animals, and rugs are not recyclable items. For more information, refer to the Sorting Category Table on [p. 17-23](#).

### Glass bottles and jars

Sort the glass items by color (clear, black, brown, and other) and put them in the designated boxes.



Clear      Black      Brown      Other colors

**! Items that cannot be disposed of as glass bottles or jars (Examples)**

Glassware      Baby bottles      Heat-resistant glass products

Opaque white cosmetics bottles      Plate glass

*\*These are different from glass bottles and jars and cannot be recycled.*

### Disposal method and cautions

- Use up the content and rinse them lightly.
- Be sure to remove the lids and rinse them. Metal ones should be disposed of as empty cans and metals, and plastic ones should be disposed of as plastic containers and packaging.
- Please wrap broken glass bottles in sturdy paper, write what's inside on the paper, and dispose of them as non-burnable garbage.

**Wrap these in sturdy paper, write what's inside on the paper, and dispose of them as non-burnable garbage.**

Broken mirrors, broken fluorescent tubes, and broken mercury body temperature thermometers

**Dispose of these as large garbage items.**

(Those longer than 60 cm or weighing more than 6 kg)

### Disposal method and cautions

- Long fluorescent tubes are very dangerous if they break, so please put them back in their original packaging when you dispose of them.
- To dispose of rechargeable batteries (Ni-Cd, NiMH, Lithium-ion, etc.), please consult the store you bought them from.
- Put button batteries in a button battery collection can at any participating collection location (electronics stores, home improvement centers, etc.).

# Burnable Garbage

Put them in the **burnable garbage** collection area by 8:30 a.m. on the collection day.



## Covered items (Main categories)

### Kitchen waste



**Vegetable scraps, leftovers, and fish bones**

Please dry these out well; doing just this can heavily reduce waste.



**Cooking oils**

Use paper or cloth to soak up the cooking oil, or use coagulants to solidify it. Also, see [p. 15](#).

### Rubber products and leather goods



**Leather goods, satchels, shoes, boots, belts, and rubber gloves**

• Metal parts that can be removed easily and plastic boots, shoes, sandals, and satchels should be disposed of as non-burnable garbage.

### Non-recyclable paper and cloth



**Sealed postcards**



**Paper diapers**  
\*Must be cleaned



**Rags**

### Grass, branches and wood chips



**Fallen leaves, grass, branches, and wood chips**

\*Please cut them down to a length of 60 cm or less and a thickness of 15 cm or less.

Put them into a bag designated for burnable garbage, tie it up, and dispose of it next to the crow-repellent net.

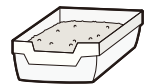

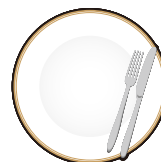

- Items longer than 60 cm that do not fit in the designated garbage bags, or those weighing more than 6 kg, are considered large garbage items.

### How can we reduce waste?

**Use up all of each ingredient**



**Eat all of your food**



**Drain the liquid from food scraps**



### Try composting in a cardboard box!

Reduce your waste by processing food scraps at home.

- To encourage people to process food scraps at home and thus reduce the amount produced by each household, we have posted a method for composting in a cardboard box on the city's website. Page ID 1027569
- Composting in a cardboard box involves using one such box to make a processing container for food scraps. In it, microorganisms decompose the scraps and create compost. Anyone can get these up and running easily.





# Non-Burnable Garbage

Put them in the **non-burnable garbage** collection area by 8:30 a.m. on the collection day.



## Covered items (Main categories)

### Glass and ceramics

Plates and bowls



Cracked glass bottles and jars and broken fluorescent tubes

- Please wrap broken items in sturdy paper and write what's inside on the paper.
- Glass bottles and jars and fluorescent tubes that are not broken are recyclables to be collected in the community (p. 7).

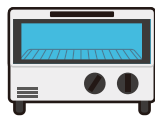

- \*If they are filled with sponge or beads \*Use up all of the gas inside
- Please return hypodermic needles used for at-home medical care to a hospital or similar facility.
- Please wrap blades and broken mirrors in sturdy paper and write what's inside on the paper.

### Disposal method and cautions

- Please put the items into a bag designated for non-burnable garbage, tie it up, and dispose of it.
- Items longer than 60 cm that do not fit in the designated garbage bags, or those weighing more than 6 kg, are considered large garbage items.
- Never dispose of spray cans or cassette gas cylinders as non-burnable garbage. Always dispose of them as empty cans and metals.



# Reduce food waste!

Food waste is food that could have been eaten but was discarded.

How much food waste does Japan produce?! 5.22 million tons.

One person's daily food waste is equivalent to one teacup full (113 g). (\*FY2020 estimate)

### What we can all do to help

Check the refrigerator before you go grocery shopping. Take items that are at the front on store shelves. Cook only as much as you can eat and freeze anything extra.



When eating out, order only enough to eat, check for a small-size menu, or look for a restaurant participating in the no leftovers campaign.



**3010 Exercise**  
To reduce the number of leftovers at a party, everyone focuses on eating for the first 30 minutes and the last 10 minutes.

Learn what expiration dates and sell-by dates actually are.  
Expiration date → The time limit for eating something safely.  
Sell-by date → The time limit for eating something at its freshest.

Passing this date doesn't mean you won't be able to eat it for much longer.



### What if I still have food left over?

**Why not take it to a food drive? By donating your house's excess food to those who need it, you can reduce food waste.**

# Large Garbage Items

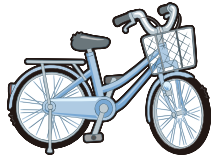

There are two ways to dispose of these items.

## Covered items

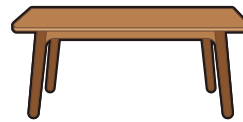
Items that do not fit in the designated garbage bags; measure 60 cm or more in length, width, or height; or weigh more than 6 kg, regardless of their size

\*Only items of a size and weight that can be carried by two adults will be accepted.  
Air conditioners, TVs, refrigerators, freezers, washing machines, dryers, and PCs are not considered large garbage items. (See p. 11-12)

## How to use the home collection service **800 yen per item** Up to five items can be accepted per application.

- 1 Call the **Large-sized Garbage Reception Center** and ask to have them collected.

(Closed on Saturdays, Sundays, national holidays, substitute holidays, and New Year's holidays)

\*IP phones cannot reach this number.

\*You can apply anywhere from one month (30 days) to one week prior to the collection date (excluding the collection date itself).  
(Example) If you apply on April 2, the closest possible collection date is April 9.

- 2 You can buy **large garbage item disposal tickets** at city hall, branch offices, supermarkets, or convenience stores (some locations do not sell them).



\*These tickets are non-refundable. Also, they cannot be reissued if they are damaged or lost.

- 3 Please write your reception number (or name) on the ticket and attach it to your large garbage item. Then, dispose of it at the designated place **by 8:30 a.m. on the collection day**. For apartment buildings, you can place items near the entrance on the first floor. \*You do not have to be there for the collection.  
\*We will not enter your living space to take any items.

## Collection days

Each district has set collection days for large garbage items.

### Disposal method and cautions

Uncrushable items such as rubble, roof tiles, concrete products, and so on that weigh up to 100 kg can be collected from your home as items unsuitable for disposal for a fee. Please apply via the Environmental Center (Tel.: 0586-45-7004). The fee is 800 yen per 50 kg. (Collection days are specified.)  
You can also bring items directly to the Environmental Center. Items removed by contractors are considered industrial waste and cannot be collected or processed by the city.

# Air Conditioners, TVs, Refrigerators and Freezers, and Washing Machines and Dryers (Four Specified Home Appliances)






Recycling fees apply to items specified in the Act on Recycling of Specified Home Appliances. **Even if you dismantle an item, it is subject to said Act.**

According to the Act on Recycling of Specified Home Appliances, manufacturers will recycle certain home appliances.

**Do not dismantle it.**

Fees apply: recycling and transportation fees are required.

If you're having difficulty getting one of the above stores to collect your product, please use one of the three methods below to dispose of it.

### Recommended

#### Method 1 - Bring it directly to the designated collection facility.

#### Method 2 - Bring it directly to the Environmental Center (No reservation required)

Pay the recycling fee in advance at a post office or Japan Post Bank.

When bringing items to the Environmental Center, you must pay a 1,600 yen transportation fee per item (two large garbage item disposal tickets). Please unload the recyclables you bring on your own.

#### Method 3 - Request collection from the Environmental Center (Reservation required)

(Collection days specified)

Pay the recycling fee in advance at a post office or Japan Post Bank.

You must pay a 2,400 yen transportation fee per item at the time of collection (three large garbage item disposal tickets).

\*A separate transaction fee is required when paying a recycling fee at the post office or Japan Post Bank.

\*Please take note of the following and bring said note with you as recycling fees differ by product.

- (1) Manufacturer name
- (2) Screen size for TVs and capacity for refrigerators, freezers, and mini fridges

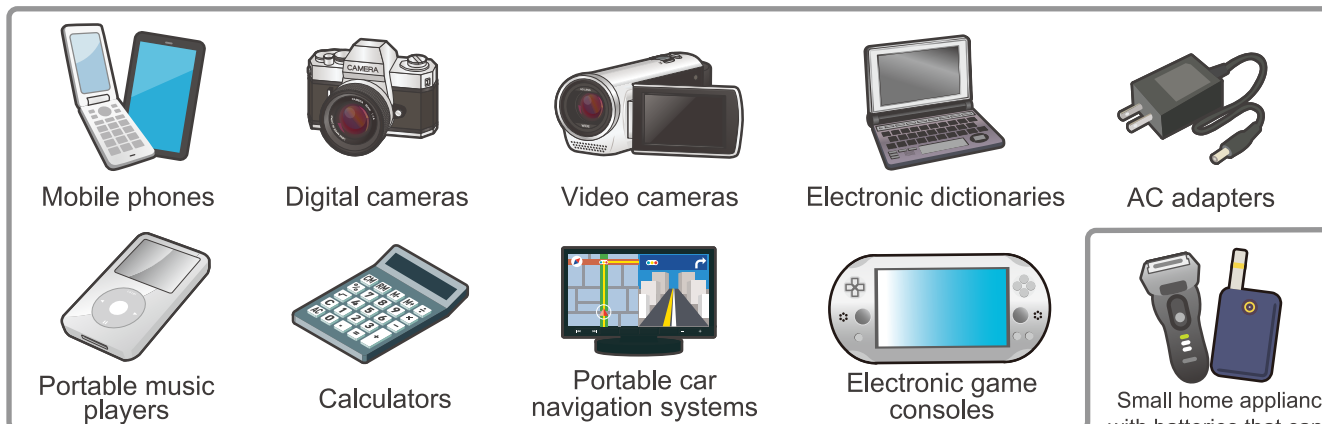
Note: We will not collect your item if the correct recycling fee has not been paid.

Note: We will not enter your living space to take any items. Please carry the items to your front door on your own.

# Collection Centers for Small Home Appliances

As part of our efforts to collect rare metals, we have set up small home appliance collection boxes to collect the following items from designated centers.

## Covered items



### Disposal method and cautions

- We can only collect main units.
- Please put your items into a small home appliance collection box on your own. (A list of facilities can be found on [p. 13.](#))
- We cannot collect items that do not fit into the opening (15 cm wide x 30 cm long). Please dispose of those as non-burnable garbage or large garbage items.
- Please erase all data on a device before disposing of it.

A courier will come at the time you request (as early as the next day).

# Disposal Method for Small Rechargeable Batteries


To avoid fire-related accidents from small rechargeable batteries (such as lithium-ion ones) during garbage collection and processing, please remove them from any small home appliances that contain them when you're disposing of said appliances.

## What is a small rechargeable battery?


They're very light and can be used over and over again, so they're used in many small home appliances.

**Small rechargeable batteries**


- Lithium-ion batteries
- Ni-Cd batteries
- NiMH batteries




**Any batteries that have recycling symbols**



Take them to any participating recycling location, such as an electronics store or home improvement center





**These can cause fires in garbage trucks or at garbage disposal plants!**  
**Please keep them separate!**

**Small home appliances with batteries that cannot be removed**

- Electric shavers
- Heated tobacco products ...and more

Take them to any of the 21 small appliance collection boxes in the city.

# Bringing Garbage to the Environmental Center (Fee Applies)

**You cannot bring in industrial waste.**

Residents of Ichinomiya City are welcome to bring in their own large garbage items or one-time large amounts of garbage produced when moving, etc. (an amount exceeding the general rule of three bags of burnable and non-burnable garbage per household) **by themselves** to the Environmental Center.

- Please be sure to separate your garbage into burnable, non-burnable, and large garbage items. If you do not, we may not be able to accept it.
- If you bring your garbage in a bag, please use one that allows us to see the content.
- If you bring in burnable, non-burnable, and large garbage items all at once, please load them into your vehicle in a way that allows burnable garbage to be removed first. After burnable garbage, please remove non-burnable garbage and large garbage items on your own.
- Please empty heaters and other such appliances of kerosene.
- If there are shards of glass or mirror on your furniture or any other items, please remove as many of them as possible.
- If you want to bring in scrap wood or other materials produced from home construction work you did on your own, please contact the Environmental Center (Tel.: 0586-48-5383) in advance so that we can confirm your location. However, there are limits to the amount you can bring and the number of times you can do so.
- For smooth unloading, etc. please do not bring your garbage in a vehicle larger than a 2-ton truck. If your vehicle is larger than that, please contact the Environmental Center in advance (Tel.: 0586-48-5383).
- See p. 15 for bringing in recyclables and p. 11 for bringing in the four specialized home appliances.
- Please follow the Sorting Category Table to see which items you can bring.
- We are very crowded during Golden Week, Obon, and the New Year's holidays. Please expect delays when you come.
- Please cut branches and other items generated when pruning garden trees to a length of 2 m or less and a thickness of 15 cm or less before bringing them in.
- Please cut long items such as hoses to a length of 2 m or less before bringing them in.

## Business-related Garbage

- Garbage generated by businesses and stores is divided into industrial waste and general business-related garbage.
- **Garbage generated by businesses cannot be disposed of at any of the city's collection areas.**
- Business operators are required to properly dispose of garbage generated by their businesses.

### Industrial waste

Industrial waste cannot be processed by the city. Please request collection from a disposal company certified as an industrial waste disposal company. Disposal companies can contact the following association.

### General business-related garbage

This is garbage generated by stores, offices, etc. that is not considered industrial waste. → This includes non-recyclable shredded paper, animal and plant remains (raw garbage), etc. \*Garbage from some industries may be considered industrial waste.

#### • Disposal method for general business-related garbage

- (1) Entrust it to a company certified to collect and transport general garbage. (Please check the city's website or contact the Waste Management Division at 0586-45-5374.)
- (2) Business operators can bring it directly to the Environmental Center. (See [p. 14](#))
