Disposal method and cautions

- o Cloth that is dirty, damaged, or wet cannot be recycled and should be disposed of as burnable garbage.
- o Futons, floor cushions, stuffed animals, and rugs are not recyclable items. For more information, refer to the Sorting Category Table on p. 17-23.

Glass bottles and jars

Sort the glass items by color (clear, black, brown, and other) and put them in the designated boxes.





Disposal method and cautions

- Use up the content and rinse them lightly.
- o Be sure to remove the lids and rinse them. Metal ones should be disposed of as empty cans and metals, and plastic ones should be disposed of as plastic containers and packaging.
- o Please wrap broken glass bottles in sturdy paper, write what's inside on the paper, and dispose of them as non-burnable garbage.







Disposal method and cautions

- Long fluorescent tubes are very dangerous if they break, so please put them back in their original packaging when you dispose of them.
- o To dispose of rechargeable batteries (Ni-Cd, NiMH, Lithium-ion, etc.), please consult the store you bought them from.
- Put button batteries in a button battery collection can at any participating collection location (electronics stores, home improvement centers, etc.).
