# Foreign language storytelling



Ichinomiya City Library (5th floor)

Every first Sunday of the month, at 11am, many parents and children gather in Ichinomiya City Library to enjoy foreign language storytelling held by Ichinomiya International Association (iia). Guest storytellers are from all over the world. They read a book or two in their mother language, and then they also introduce their culture, nursery rhymes, or do fun games.

In April, Ms. Yamabata from Qingdao, China, read the Chinese picture book "Little monkey got distracted". After reading the book she introduced some of the cultural differences between China and Japan. Many children were surprised to find out that Chinese school year begins in fall.





In May, Mr. Dung from Vietnam read "A legend of watermelon".

He told the audience that the legend has a history of 2000~2500 years.

In June, iia staff Alessandra read the Italian translation of "そらまめくんのぼくのいちにち"

(Una giornata di Tobia) and the English translation of " $\langle \lambda \downarrow \lambda \mathcal{O} \langle \mathcal{S} \langle \lambda \rangle$ " (Blackie, the crayon).

These popular Japanese picture books were written by Nakaya Miwa. Her exhibition will be held at the Ichinomiya City Memorial Art Museum of Migishi Setsuko from June 30th till August 19th.



This event is a great chance for children to be exposed to foreign people, language, and culture. If you have a book from your own country and would like to share it with people in Ichinomiya, please raise your hand to be one of the guest storytellers.

# TWhat is Japanese High School Like?



On June 16<sup>th</sup> an instructive meeting was held by "iia" for foreign children who want to go to high school. 33 people (children and their parents) came to attend it at Kikyokaikan.

They were divided into three groups according to their speaking language, English, Chinese, and Tagalog.

First, Mr. Ichida Hiroyuki from Okoshi Technical High School gave lectures on high school education system and school life. He also explained in detail about Japanese language supports in high school and the procedure about how to take an entrance examination. His lecture was interpreted for the three language group members respectively.





Next, Ms. Kato Reiko from Nihongo Hiroba Junior advised them the importance of high school education in their future lives. And then she said "Preparing for your entrance examination, it is important for you to attend junior high school class as much as you can in order to get higher score in school reports."

The parents who attended there asked many questions about transport, school expenses, and others.
Children there hopefully said they would practice their Japanese harder to enter a high school.

# Enjoy "Bon-Odori" dancing festival.

Bon-Odori is a traditional Japanese folk dancing. Kids, young and old, everyone gathers, in a mid-summer evening, tempted by the dance music to a community plaza, every year.

They enjoy the dance, making a few concentric circles of the persons, or when they get tired from dancing they can enjoy seeing it from the outside of the circle.

People dance to the cheerful music and led by the rhythm of the drum, which is called "Taiko" in Japanese, and the circles proceed ahead slowly while dancing. As it is very easy to dance, I'm sure you can smoothly dance soon.

Why not find your community plaza and enjoy the dancing festival with your family or your friend.

If you are interested in a large scale "Bon-Odori" festival in Ichinomiya city, you can join it, at 138 Tower Park,on August 11(Sat.) and 12(Sun.), 18:00 thru. 20:30.


